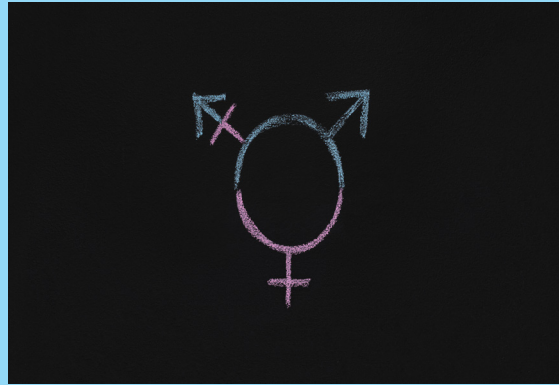


HIV & Aging in the Transgender Community: Clinical Care and Lived Experience
